

Para. 258. CENTRAL REGISTER FOR SPECIALISED EMPLOYMENT.

Applicants for employment from middle class and professional people whose livelihood has been destroyed through the war should not be advised to apply to the Central Register of the Ministry of Labour.

The great majority of such applicants can be dealt with at Employment Exchanges. If their qualifications subsequently prove to be exceptional they will be passed on to the Central Register.

The following professions have their own register:

Doctors, nurses, pharmacists, medical auxiliaries (masseurs, chiropodists, etc.). They can also be referred to the Ministry of Health, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1.

Fully qualified Solicitors and Barristers should be asked to apply to the Secretary of the Legal Appointments Committee, Lord Chancellor's Department, House of Lords.
